Here are the celebrities who will headline the club's informal *Celebrity Meet & Greet Gaming Education Series* at the World's Largest Casino Chip and Collectibles exhibition, which runs Thursday thru Saturday, June 15-17, 2023, at the South Point Hotel and Casino in Las Vegas:



Joan Destino. Author of the novel *River Card*, she has turned her poker experience in Las Vegas into a page-turner five-star book. Talk writing and poker with her 10 a.m. to Noon p.m. on Thursday June 15.

Eric Endy. His father Paul Endy founded the iconic casino chip and dice manufacturer Paul-Son Gaming Supplies. Eric has written a book on the company and will greet show attendees from 2 p.m. to 4 p.m. on Thursday June 15.





Nelson Sardelli. The movie star, comedian, singer, dancer, and Vegas entertainment legend will share his hilarious stories with visitors from 10 a.m. to Noon on Friday Jume 16.





Troy Stern. Representing her craft, veteran Showgirl Troy Stern will be sharing her stories of the highly choreographed casino entertainment of a bygone era from Noon to 2 p.m. Friday June 16.

Tom McEvoy. He won the 1983 World Series of Poker Main Event and was inducted into the Poker Hall of Fame in 2013. Talk poker with him from 2 p.m. to 4 p.m. on Friday, June 16.



The *Celebrity Meet & Greet Gaming Education Series* is the personification of the Casino Collectibles Association's objective to foster the preservation and education of gaming history. Each gaming celebrity has volunteered their time to greet, meet and mingle with show attendees, answer their questions and satisfy their curiosity about the personality's unique role in the shaping of the gaming industry we know today.

More About the Show

The Casino Collectibles Association's annual exposition and show is open to the public. It is a must-see event for anybody who is fascinated by gaming history. Visitors can see, touch and feel the greatest collection of casino memorabilia from all over the world.
